THREE ARRESTED FOR TRADE IN ENDANGERED SPECIES

Rustenburg – Three suspects aged 32, 43 and 45 appeared before the Rustenburg Magistrates' Court on Monday 27 July for the possession of a pangolin, which is an endangered species. The trio's court appearance follows their apprehension on 23 July, after members of the Provincial Organised Crime Unit made a follow up on information about suspects who wanted to sell a pangolin close to the Waterfall Mall in Rustenburg. According to information received, the police spotted a silver Ford Figo with Gauteng registration number plates in the vicinity of the mall. The vehicle was approached for a search. According to police spokesperson lieutenant colonel Amanda Funani, the pangolin was found inside the vehicle and the suspects were arrested. Provincial commissioner of North West, lieutenant general Sello Kwenia, applauded the Provincial Organised Crime Unit for their success. He also thanked members of the community for their valuable information which led to the arrest.

TWO SUSPECTS IN CHURCH SHOOTING – FROM RUSTENBURG

Rustenburg – Two of the 41 suspects implicated in a shooting incident which occurred at a church in the West Rand on Sunday 11 July are from Kanana, Rustenburg. Five people lost their lives at the International Pentecostal Holiness Church in Zuurbekom when the group attacked congregants and announced they were taking over the premises. Law enforcement officers from the South African Police Services (SAPS), South African National Defence Forces (SANDF), Johannesburg Metro Police Department (JMPD) and the Department of Correctional Services were among the 41 suspects arrested and charged for the incident. Over 34 firearms – including five rifles, 16 short guns and 13 pistols – were also seized by the police during the arrest. The killings are allegedly linked to a leadership feud between sons of the late church leader Glayton Modise who died in 2016. A spokesperson from the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) Phindi Mjonondwane said the suspects face charges of murder, attempted murder and malicious damage to property. The bail application of all 41 suspects commenced at the Westonaria Magistrates Court on Monday 27 July. Mjonondwane told *Platinum Weekly* that the process might take days owing to the high number of suspects involved.

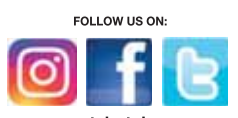
