No good deed goes unpunished – “please call me”

Rustenburg – A Grade 8 learner almost fell victim to two criminals who attempted to steal his cellphone on Friday 23 April. Luckily, after receiving information from the public, police intervened, and the robbers’ attempts were foiled. According to police spokesperson captain Elsabé Augoustides, the modus operandi of these two males in the vicinity of Hyper Slaghuis, is to approach children and ask them if they can please send a ‘please call me’ from their cellphones. Several kids fell victim when they good-heartedly handed over their phones to the robbers, who then ran off with their phones.

Rustenburg councillor survives shooting

Rustenburg – An unknown gunman shot a Rustenburg Local Municipality (RLM) councillor in the chest on Tuesday 27 April. Councillor Zenzele Xhinela of ward 41, who was shot after the intruder gained access into his home in Seraleng, survived the attempt on his life and is now recovering in hospital.

Police spokesperson captain Afje Botma confirmed the incident: “At this stage police are still busy investigating the attempted murder case.” No arrests have been made as yet. Botma was not at liberty to divulge the nature of the evidence collected at the scene of the crime.

Reacting to the incident, Rustenburg Local Municipality executive mayor Mpho Khunou said: “We condemn this callous act, which almost claimed the life of one of our most dedicated councillors. We wish councillor Zenzele a speedy recovery and have faith that our law enforcement officers will bring the perpetrator/s to book.”



THEFT CAUSE POWER OUTAGES

Rustenburg – The Rustenburg Local Municipality (RLM) revealed that power outages experienced in parts of the city on Wednesday 22 April were caused by theft and vandalism.

Municipal spokesperson David Magae expressed his concern at the financial setbacks of these criminal actions on the local governing body’s operations and local businesses as well as the inconvenience caused to residents.

“While the inconvenience is regrettable, the RLM through investigations led by the city’s electrical personnel, discovered that the power outages were as a result of theft of earthing wires and the subsequent damage to the protection relays at the park substation.”

Magae stressed the importance of a collective effort by residents, neighbourhood watches, and community policing forums to rid the city of these criminal elements.

House robbery duo in court

Brits – Two suspects appeared before the Brits Magistrates' Court on Wednesday 28 April on charges of conspiracy to commit a house robbery, pointing a firearm, and the possession of an unlicensed firearm. Jonathan Mathunduluka (25) and Sifiso Manana (42), who were making their second court appearance, were arrested on 21 April during their unsuccessful attempt to rob a house in Brits.

"Crime Intelligence officials working with members of the Brits Tactical Response Team (TRT) and National Intervention Unit (NIU) reacted swiftly on a tip-off," police spokesperson captain Sam Tselanyane explained. "Consequently, the suspects' vehicle, a Nissan Almera with three occupants was seen arriving at the targeted house."

The robbers became aware of the police

officers and one of the suspects pointed a firearm at the police. The suspect was shot and wounded. He dropped his firearm and fled the scene on foot while the other two were cornered and apprehended.

The firearm as well as the vehicle they used were confiscated for further investigation.



Swartruggens community brings N4 to a standstill

Swartruggens – Swartruggens community members who were fed up with the lack of service delivery by the Kgetlengrivier Local Municipality expressed their frustration by blocking off the N4 near Swartruggens on Sunday 25 April.

"We will close off the town until we have water and electricity. We are tired of the municipality doing patchwork jobs instead of repairing things properly. There have even been instances where the community had to provide cables for the municipality to repair faults. This is unacceptable, and we will no longer stand for this," an angry

Swartruggens community member told the *Platinum Weekly*.

Traffic had to be reverted to Spitskop. A truck driver on scene said: "We were stuck for more than two hours in Swartruggens when we were traveling from Pretoria on the N4. I felt unsafe, the situation was tense."

Another community member added: "We received no response whatsoever from the municipality and they didn't even bother to show up. I think as a community our next move should be filing a motion of no confidence against the municipal committee and the provincial departments."

FIXING IT THEMSELVES

Swartruggens residents repair electricity and water supply

Swartruggens – Service company Pionier and Kgetlengrivier Concerned Residents (KCR) burned the midnight oil on Sunday evening (25 April) and Monday morning to help restore the electricity and water supply in Swartruggens after the town went without electricity for several days. The power failure meant that the pump station, which is managed by the two organisations, could not supply the Swartruggens community with water. Pionier and KCR purchased and installed a new electrical cable. The pump room at Boralelo settlement also suffered damages by vandals, who broke the locks and cut the wires. A case of sabotage was opened at the town's SAPS' station. Residents protested, closing off



roads to show their dissatisfaction with the municipality's failure to do the repair and maintenance work. On Friday, AfriForum placed the municipality on terms in a bid to force them to take the necessary steps to restore electricity supply. According to Petrus Coetzee, AfriForum's district coordinator for Marico, the protest action is a sign of the community's frustration with poor service delivery. "Swartruggens is a mirror of the country's municipal problems. We expect many similar protest actions by frustrated community members in the run-up to the elections later this year."

"Because of the sabotage by malicious groups for political gain, and because of the municipality's unwillingness and inability to solve their problems, members of the

community have no other choice but to step in and provide the services themselves. Pionier is proud to work alongside the local community to solve problems and ensure sustainable service delivery in communities. It is heart-warming to witness the community's self-do attitude and the support by Pionier's personnel," said Johan Kruger, director of Pionier Dienstemaatskappy. According to Wilhelm Rochér, local community leader, the community has a proud record of self-do initiatives and being able to solve problems themselves. "We are pleased to be able to help the community in the midst of the poor condition of state infrastructure and municipal negligence – to intervene and repair. After our involvement, the Boralelo settlement once again has water and can look forward to clean, running water."

Rustenburg – Geelhout Park extension 6, in particular Pendoring Avenue, is flooded. I mean, really flooded. It almost looks like we've been blessed with heavy rainfalls.

I am not talking about a small leakage; I am talking about a massive leak that has not been attended to for over two weeks. How much more water must be wasted before the Rustenburg Local Municipality is going to fix it? The water has been gushing from a 32mm pipe for the last two weeks, flooding two adjacent properties (which includes my property) in Pendoring Avenue. I have been building dam walls to try and prevent the water from entering my property, but to no avail. What a waste of clean, potable water!

I have reported this wastage several times and have received three different reference numbers. They have been giving me nothing but lip service.

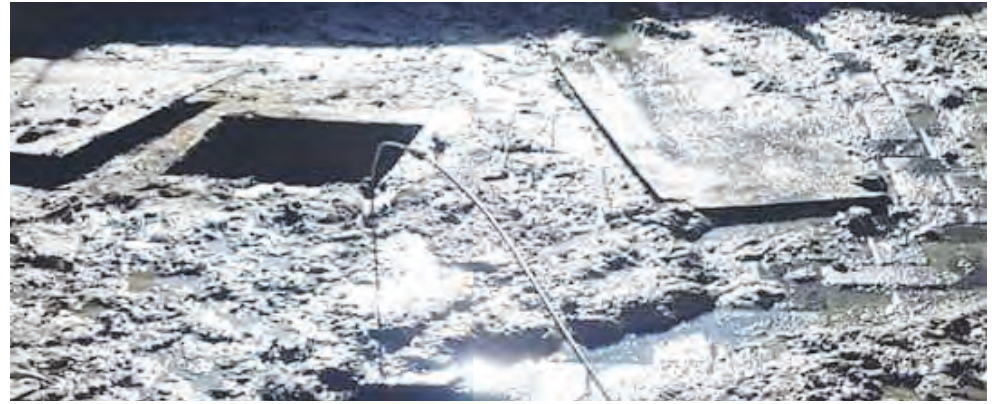

Looming public health crisis as Rustenburg fails to address backlog of at least 475 blocked sewer complaints

O crap – no pun intended!

The Democratic Alliance (DA) will follow up on charges against Rustenburg Local Municipality (RLM) for failing to address the backlog of sewerage blocks which now threatens to create a public health crisis. In September last year, the DA laid charges against Rustenburg Local Municipality for contravening Section 151(1)(l) and (j) and Section 19 of the National Water Act, Act 36 of 1998. The DA has been monitoring the performance of the municipality's Sanitation Unit. There are at least 475 sanitation complaints that reflected on the call centre's call sheet regarding blocked sewerage pipes spilling raw effluent onto our streets and into the stormwater system which eventually pollutes the Dorpspruit and Hex river. Upon enquiry, the Sanitation Unit informed

us that the backlog is caused by insufficient resources. This is due to an alleged adjustment to the budget which stripped the Sanitation Unit of valuable resources. During the Adjustment budget tabled on 30 March 2021, R30 million was allocated for infrastructure purposes relating to water reticulation and electricity. It is now alleged that none of this capital is being made available towards sanitation. On two occasions now, the DA requested meetings with the MM, giving him ten days in advance to prepare to meet the DA and on both occasions, the MM cancelled the meetings citing health issues or other commitments. The municipality is in contravention of the National Water Management Act, the

National Environmental Management Act, specifically Section 49(A)(1)(e) and (f), which states that unlawfully and intentionally or negligently committing any act or omission which detrimentally affects or is likely to detrimentally affect the environment, and Section 24 of the Constitution and the Municipal Systems Act for failing to provide municipal services. Further to following up on the charges, the DA will request our Provincial Spokesperson on Cooperative Governance, Human Settlements and Traditional Affairs (COGHSTA), Freddy Sonakile MPL, to write to COGHSTA MEC Mmoloki Cwaile, to visit the City of Rustenburg to experience first-hand the overwhelming stench of raw sewage that the municipality fails to address.

Improve service delivery... or else!

Cosatu Rustenburg chairperson Maleho Gaonakala laid a wreath at the graves of the late Moses and Rebecca Kotane.

Rustenburg – Confederation of South African Trade Unions (COSATU) in Rustenburg said it will not support any re-election bid by ANC councillors who are failing to serve the interests of their communities during the run-up to the local government elections.

The municipal elections will be held on Wednesday 27 October and the run-up to those polls is likely to see ANC and other political parties like the Democratic Alliance (DA) and the Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) canvassing intensely for support from the electorate.

Maleho Gaonakala, who was recently elected chairperson of COSATU Rustenburg,

said the labour federation would refuse to support councillors with a chequered history during the upcoming polls.

Speaking to *Platinum Weekly* soon after laying wreaths at the graves of South African liberation struggle icons Moses and Rebecca Kotane, Goanakala bemoaned the service delivery protests in Rustenburg and other parts of the Bojanala Platinum District Municipality (BPDM).

"The Cosatu leadership will never support corrupt candidates in the upcoming local elections. Councillors who have shown signs of opposing the aspirations of workers will also not receive our support," Gaonakala said.

Mixed reactions to political party funding act

Rustenburg – While the African National Congress (ANC) believes the Political Party Funding Act will ensure equality on the political playing field, the Democratic Alliance (DA) has expressed some reservations with the legislation.

The act, which came into effect on Thursday 1 April, created a framework to regulate the public and private funding of political parties with the aim of establishing transparency and trust between the public and political parties. According to the act, political parties are no longer allowed to accept donations above R15 million from a sole donor.

The legislation also disallows donations from foreign governments and their agencies, foreign persons and entities, organs of state as well as state-owned enterprises. Political parties must fully disclose, within a specific time frame, all the money they would have received, including membership fees. They are now also required to explain how these funds were used.

ANC interprovincial committee (IPC) spokesperson Kenny Morolong lauded the act as a document that creates transparency on the political playing field. "I support the political party funding act. The political party funding act promotes transparency and accountability. It exposes political parties

that benefit from the proceeds of corruption, tax evasion, and illicit financial flows," he said. "This act provides South Africans with information about funding of political parties and empowers the electorate to wisely choose their preferred party during elections."

However, Morolong's assertion that the constitution protects any funder from potential victimisation by other political rivals is not shared by DA National Assembly member Cheryl Phillips. Phillips said the possibility of a political funder being harassed is a realistic one that could create a disadvantage for opposition parties like the DA.

"Many South African companies rely on business from the local, provincial and national governments. These companies might be concerned about the backlash from the governing party if they are seen to be supporting any of the opposition parties financially," Phillips said. "Likewise, individuals who are seen to be financing opposition parties might also be targeted by the governing party or its members. The above scenarios are very plausible and will be to the detriment of democracy in South Africa. The DA will comply with the requirements in the bill," she concluded.

BEWARE OF YOUR SURROUNDINGS

Rustenburg – On Saturday evening 24 April at approximately 19:10, a young lady drove back to her house after visiting friends. She first stopped at a local neighbourhood tuck shop to buy a few things. As she drove off, she noticed a stationary white minibus with the driver leaning out of the window next to the road.

When she passed him, he tried to look into her vehicle and subsequently followed her at a distance. When she stopped at her residence and wanted to get out to open the gate, the minibus first passed her and then made a U-turn and came back. He parked next to her vehicle.

The young lady was luckily still in her vehicle and she kept calm. Thinking quickly, she slammed the hooter of her vehicle. One of the residents came out and saw the man with the minibus that was already outside his vehicle. When the driver spotted the resident, he just said "eish" and got into the minibus and drove off fast.

What was his intentions? We can only speculate but residents are warned, especially women, to be alert of their surroundings all the time. Trust your sixth sense. Rather be safe than sorry. Become part of a close group of people that can be of help during potentially emergency situations like these. Even become part of your local neighbourhood watch structures.



METASEC Security Solutions general manager Morné Engelbrecht shared a few safety tips:

- If possible, try not to drive alone after sunset.
- Rather drive that extra 3km and stop at a convenience shop at a fuel station or a well-lit shopping complex, but do not let your guard down. Be vigilant and observant.
- Before you get out of your vehicle, make sure of your surroundings, check for any suspicious vehicles or individuals hanging around or approaching your vehicle. At this stage, your vehicle is your first line of defence. Don't get out of your vehicle if you do not feel safe.

After you have done your shopping:

1. Have your vehicle keys ready and as you approach your vehicle, observe. Look around and walk with an 'attitude'. Do not make it visible that you may be a bit scared.
2. When you are at the driver's door, turn around and open the door from your back. This ensures that you have a full 270° view of any suspect that can come to your side of the vehicle.
3. Once inside your vehicle, immediately lock the doors. Refrain from looking at your cell phone or texting.
4. Your wallet, handbag and cell phone must not be placed on the passenger seat or any place where it is visible.
5. When you suspect that a vehicle or person might be following you, rather drive past your residence and stop at a fuel station as most of them have good security cameras and call for assistance from inside your vehicle. If you see a patrol vehicle from a security company or a neighbourhood watch vehicle, you can also stop next to them and inform them of the vehicle/person you suspect that is following you.
6. Change your traveling routine. Do not make use of the same route or routine every day.
7. Prepare yourself beforehand how to handle and act situations like these by playing off a scenario in your head and how you would react.

As international self-defence course instructor Vince May would say: "Train to live another day."

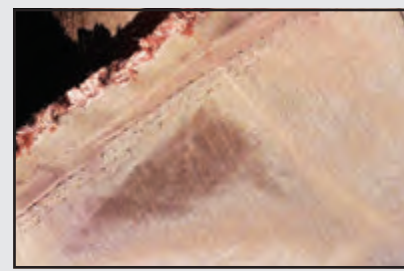

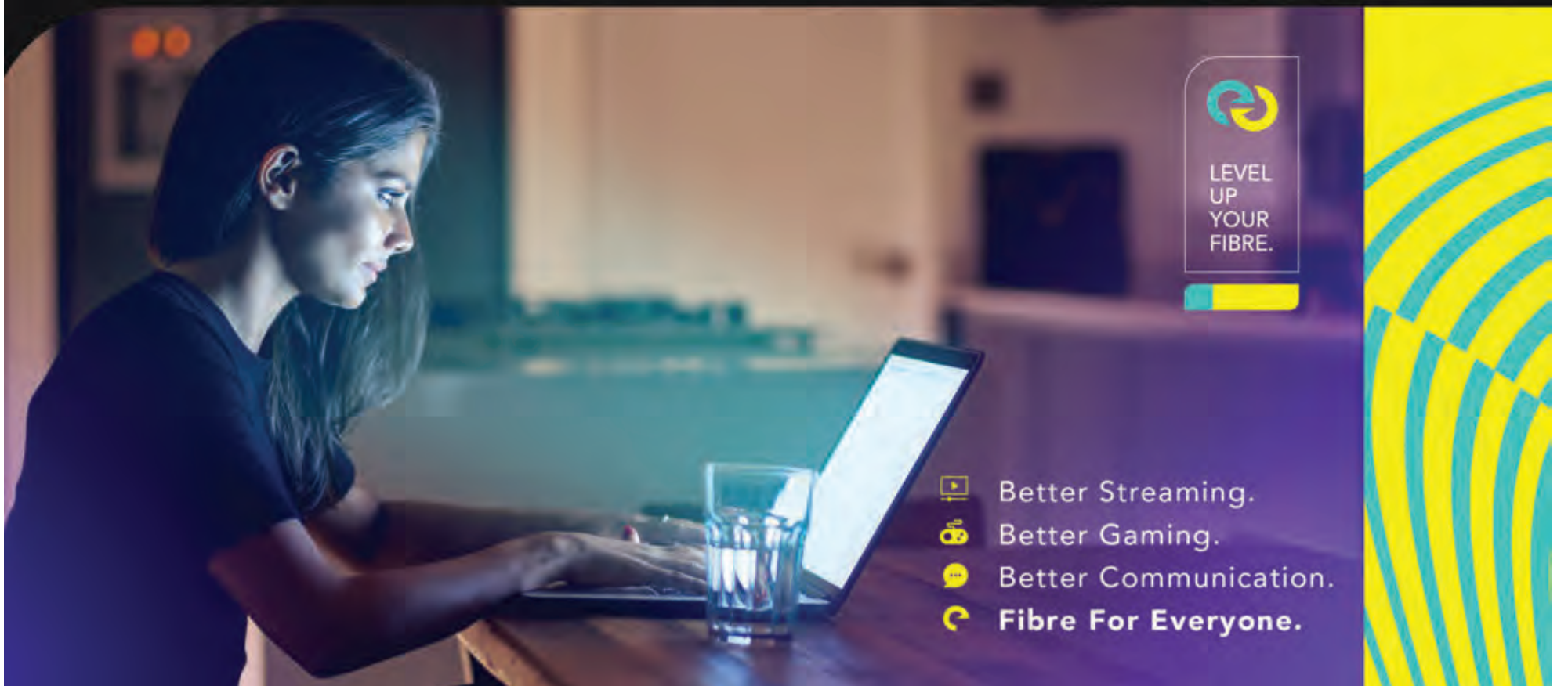

- A clean, dry bowl

- 500g self-rising flower
- 1 can condensed milk
- 1 can sweetcorn

Instructions

1. Preheat the oven to 180°C.
2. Mix the self-rising flower, condensed milk, and sweet corn together in a mixing bowl with a wooden spoon.
3. Line a baking pan with baking paper and use spray and cook on the paper.
4. Place the dough in the baking pan.
5. Bake for 1 hour.
6. Cut into thick slices and serve with butter.

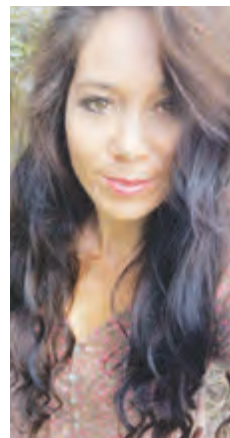

Fake HPCSA Letters

Pretoria – The Inspectorate Office within the ambit of the Health Professions Council of South Africa (HPCSA) was established in 2015 to focus on its primary role of ensuring that the registered healthcare practitioners comply with the provisions of the Act, as well as all rules and regulations governing the practitioners. The HPCSA would like to make practitioners aware of an alleged “Hawks’ investigator” that is targeting foreign registered practitioners by claiming that they are being investigated and

threatening them with fake HPCSA letters, which state that they are under investigation and thereby demanding money not to be arrested. Council is currently collating all the information and will report the matter to the South African Police Service (SAPS). 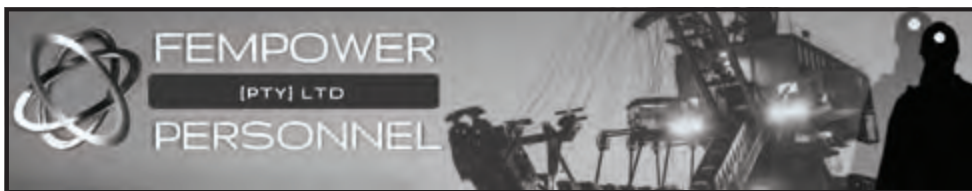

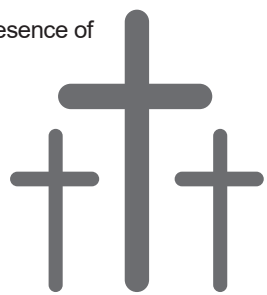
